- Cyber Range: a real-world simulation platform that allows security teams to train (attack and defense), develop their expertise, and manage their human resources planning

- Survey research to complete the guideline analysis
 - Oct-Nov 2022 (survey, analysis, reporting)
 - 20 questions x 20-30 minutes x **10 participants**
- Formulation of (re)design ideas (Dec 2022)
- Test-and-refine of (re)design ideas (Dec 2022 Feb 2023)
 - Low fidelity prototype (sketch) + informal online validation
 - Iterative and incremental improvement of the (re)design proposal and reporting
